Clergy Greetings

Merry Christmas! Welcome to Metropolitan United Church. Our roots are anchored in a small log church built where Commerce Court now stands. The year was 1818. Methodists trekked through the snow of Old York to fire up the wood stove and sing the songs of Christmas. Over the last 200 years, many downtown churches were seeded by our Methodist ancestors.

The first building on the current site, raised in 1872, seated 2,200 people on the main floor and horseshoe-shaped gallery. In 1928, a fire destroyed the structure. Two hundred firefighters fought the cold of a Toronto winter to save the tower and the great carillon you heard tonight. In 1929, this second building, modelled after Doncaster parish church in England, was dedicated to the Glory of God. Its magnificent Casavant pipe organ, the largest in Canada, with over 8,300 pipes, provides the loom for weaving public worship.

We continue to strive for excellence, to inspire greatness in others, and to heal the wounds of urban life. We are grateful to the foundations, corporations, government agencies, civic and community leaders, interest groups and volunteers who join us in this work. You are welcome here.
