Roy Lee will play a special **carillon postlude** today to bid farewell and safe return to some of our historic bells. This week, Meeks & Watson will remove the 31 treble bells and take them to their foundry in Ohio for retuning and refitting over the winter months. The 23 heaviest bells will stay put, and permit the playing of simple tunes. (This was the original size of the carillon between 1922 and 1960.) The renovation project is scheduled to wrap up next spring, in time for Pentecost.
