

SERMON "A LONG MEMORY"

THE REV. JASON MEYERS

Anthem Faith in Peace

On a shattering night of fire and death, the humble dwellings lay in rubble charred, a single wall remained, amidst the smoke, bearing a tablet smeared with ash and tar: Sacred to the memory of the men of Alice Street who died for peace during the Great War. Our dreams of peace are far too small, we seek our own peace brought about in our own way. We conquer outer space but fail the test of conquering ourselves and of conquering our fears each day. Peace demands more than our self-serving schemes, she seeks our resolve, she seeks our best. May we never lose our faith in peace.

The ministry of music is offered by the **Metropolitan Choir** conducted by Minister of Music **Dr. Patricia Wright**, by the Wayne C. Vance Organ Scholar **Timothy Wisnicki**, by trumpeter **Sarah Hemeon**, and by **Rory Sinclair**, piper to the Earl of Caithness.

Greeters are **Jean Robison** and **Muriel Griffith**.

Ushers are Vicki Harris, Jennifer McDonald, Joseph Curry, and Gunn Wongsuwan.

TODAY'S MUSIC includes organ music by French composer Jean Langlas, and his Chant Héroïque was written in memory of organist and composer Jehan Alain who was killed on duty at the beginning of World War II. Elgar wrote his *Enigma Variations* in 1898-99, and the *Nimrod* variation has become popular in its own right and is sometimes used at British funerals, memorial services, and other solemn occasions. Before Your Throne I Stand is from the 'Leipzig' chorale preludes by Bach. Highland Cathedral is a popular piping tune which has been arranged for organ and pipes by James Wetherald, and we welcome piper Rory Sinclair. Mark Sirett is a well-known Canadian composer and conductor based in Kingston, Ontario. Faith in Peace was commissioned by the Burlington Civic Chorale under the direction of Gary Fisher, and Janet Gadeski arranged the text from Lester Bowles Pearson's 1957 Nobel Peace Prize acceptance speech.
