Today's Music includes works by Bach (listen for the river Jordan in 16th notes underneath the chorale melody in *Christ Our Lord to Jordan Came*), a traditional setting by Elizabeth Poston, and an anthem by Toronto composer Carmine Lappano. The Offertory Solo is Britten's setting of a traditional Welsh New Year's carol reflecting the custom of sprinkling fresh well water on the faces of passersby. The postlude is the concluding movement from Messiaen's suite (composed in 1935). In "God among us", listen for the use of descending musical passages – both in the manuals and in the pedals – to symbolize God's descent to earth in the form of Jesus. Also, in the middle section, God seems to come to a very busy world, complete with the sound of Parisian car horns!

SPIRITUAL LEARNING FOR LIFE

YOUTH CANOE TRIP: Gibimishakaadimin ("we paddle forward together") is a five-year project of reconciliation launched as a direct outcome of the recommendations of the TRC Report. Now going into its fourth year, it brings together Indigenous youth - literally from coast to coast to coast - together with non-Indigenous youth from the Toronto area in the spirit of Truth and Reconciliation. All participant costs are funded by area United Churches and the wider church.

From August 21 to August 29, a total of 20 youth ages 14 to 18, with three young adults in training, will embark on nine days and eight nights of learning about each other and the richness of Indigenous cultural and community histories. This journey of paddling together and fostering relationships through a canoe trip and experiential learning on both land and water will take place deep in the heart of the Canadian Shield. 
