Today's Music includes organ music by Victor Togni (1935-1965) who was born in Tanganyika of Swiss parents, studied in Europe, and was organist of Toronto's St. Michael's Cathedral at the time of his death. Paul Hofreiter was a Juilliard trained composer, writing more than 100 organ preludes and 75 church anthems. He taught at Westminster Choir College in New Jersey. American composer Morten Lauridsen is Professor of Composition at the University of Southern California and has become one of the most popular and well-known modern choral composers.
