



Today's Music includes organ music appropriate to the Lenten season. Mozart's famous 'Ave Verum Corpus' will be included in our annual Good Friday concert on April 10. Renowned Canadian conductor and composer Stephanie Martin teaches at York University in Toronto.

Today is the first of the six Sundays in Lent, the period for the church leading up to the death and the resurrection of Jesus, at Easter, this year on April 12. It has been a tradition in the Church to observe this as a time of reflection, lament and preparation. Each week we will extinguish one of the six candles you see at the front of the Sanctuary - a ritual called 'Tenebrae,' latin for darkness. This tradition is a reminder that the Christian story moves to a place of darkness and loss before settling on a story of hope and resurrection.
